Upcoming Meeting - March 27, 2023

On March 27th, our guest speaker will be **Justin Burns**. Justin grew up in Farmers Branch, Texas and studied close to home at the University of North Texas. He earned his BFA focusing on Studio Drawing and Painting in 2013. Justin is interested in spaces and objects that may have had special meaning at one point in time but are now an object of permanence or a lingering memory of a time once past. What sparked this interest was when his family had a fire and lost all they owned, and he began to think about the memory of spaces and objects, their presence and the stories they withheld. One place in particular is Justin's family farm that was established in 1914 and still resides in the small town of Kopperl, TX. The renderings of Kopperl are interior and exterior weathered relic-like structures that once were an icon to the town, and are now headstones. Nostalgic images of the Burns family farm, the kitchen or living room whispers the memory of family gatherings and quiet moments. Though there is no one left in these spaces and a slow descent as time takes its toll, there is still life, a presence, and a story.

Justin is currently an art educator for the NISD school district and is a Golden Working Artist for Golden Paints.



Many thanks to **Cinda Covel** of the Edmond Visual Arts Commission, who came out in February to tell us all about Edmond's public art program. Cinda had so many interesting stories about the different sculptures and other public art pieces in Edmond! There are currently 311 sculptures placed in various locations of Edmond, with a value of over \$12 million. Before 2001, Edmond's public art collection had just eight pieces. In 2001, Randel Shadid wrote Edmond Ordinance 2653, which allowed the city of Edmond to match 50/50 toward the price of a sculpture, up to \$30,000. Anything exceeding that \$30,000 is then up to the donors. To date, private donations have exceeded the city portion by over \$1.2 million, showing the priority that the people of Edmond place on art.

There is a tour available, which you can sign up for through the City of Edmond's website. In 2019, over 140 people attended art tours around Edmond. The tours last almost all day, which is enough time to show off about half of the pieces of art work in Edmond. The cost to attend the tour is \$15, and lunch and a van ride are provided. Each sculpture has a unique story -- some will amaze or surprise you, some will make you laugh, while others will stir emotions.

The City of Edmond and its supportive residents are looking to the future, and are working towards expanding the collection of sculptures. In late 2024 (hopefully), the Uncommon Ground Park will open, where they will have at least 60 new pieces of art work to be admired.


